Have you noticed the orange "no parking this side street cleaning" signs on your street? That sign is a part of the Clean Cleveland initiative created to keep Cleveland streets clean without dangerous debris and abandoned buildings. Through this initiative, City of Cleveland departments and divisions are coordinated across boundaries to provide services, including, but not limited to: waste collection, abandoned structure board up or demolition, street sweeping, street light and traffic signal repair, graffiti removal, and roadside debris pick-up.

There are ways that you can be a part of this initiative.

- Be eyes and ears for your community; report high weeds and grass, graffiti, standing water, street and traffic light outages, and abandoned properties and vehicles
- Report illegal activity in and around abandoned buildings
- Keep your neighborhood clean and healthy by disposing of waste properly, recycling, and keeping up with yard work and important repairs to your home and property
- Move cars off the street when street cleaning signs are posted

News You Can Use - STOP UNWANTED MAIL

Are you tired of receiving junk mail? Now, there are ways to opt-out. Thanks to the Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District, there are several methods to stop junk mail from going to your home. Contact one or all of the following companies and ask to be removed from their mailing lists. After a few months, you will begin to receive less unwanted mail.

Mail Preference Service (MPS) https://www.dmaconsumers.org/cgi/offmailing

Register with the MPS of the Direct Marketing Association for a \$1.00 fee to have your name placed on a "delete" file sent to companies four times a year. Registration is good for five years. This will stop new solicitations but you will still receive mail from companies with which you currently do business. Since not all companies use MPS to purge their mailing lists, you may still receive some promotions. In this instance, contact the company directly to be placed on their do-not-mail list.

Neighborhood Grant Opportunity Ranging From \$500 to \$5,000

Neighborhood groups, street clubs and block clubs can apply for a Neighborhood Connections grant ranging from \$500 to \$5,000 through The Cleveland Foundation. Beat the heat this summer! The Council for Economic Opportunities in Greater Cleveland is providing free air conditioners to anyone age 60 or older or those with a medical condition. In addition to the free air conditioner, qualified recipients may also receive money to help pay high utility bills.

To apply, applicants must obtain a doctor's statement that confirms that their health condition can be helped by the air conditioner. Recipients must be low-income residents that live in Cuyahoga County, that's \$40,250 a year or less for a family of four. This assistance is available through the end of August.
