The We Are Buckeye Neighborhood Plan was created by Burten, Bell, Carr Development Inc. (BBC), along with partners, to record the residents of Greater Buckeye's voices and plan for the future of the neighborhood. This May, we will host the last event of the We Are Buckeye Plan Launch series.

The We Are Buckeye Plan focuses on many topics, but mainly on creating generational health and wealth for the current residents. As the Buckeye Neighborhood Plan was rolled out, BBC hosted numerous events in mid-February with the goal of empowering and engaging the residents and local stakeholders of Buckeye around the We Are Buckeye plan. Those events consisted of the Community Visioning Session, WE ARE BUCKEYE Panel Discussion, and a Neighborhood UNITY Happy Hour.

All the events were facilitated in multiple community hubs, with the hopes of connecting all parts of the neighborhood together.

As summer approaches, BBC will be hosting the Buckeye Neighborhood Partner Stroll. This will be the final event of the neighborhood plan launch series. The Partner Stroll will be held May 27th, 2023 at The Meeting Place Learning Center at Our Lady of Peace, another Buckeye community hub.

CONSTRUCTION REPORT FOR SPRING 2023

Every Clevelanders least favorite season has once again crept upon us, construction season. We'd like to share some of the details about projects that will impact our service area and residents.

The East 79th Street Rehabilitation Project is scheduled to be completed by November 2023. This construction will take place on E. 79th Street between Woodland Avenue and Chester Avenue. The estimated construction cost is \$3.5 million that will be funded by Ohio Public Works Commission-Issue 1, City Road & Bridge Bonds and Utility Funds.



The construction project will include pavement repairs, new ADA compliant curb ramps, traffic control improvement, water service line repairs, and signing and pavement upgrades including improvements to bike lanes. Residents can learn more by calling the office of your city council member at 216.644.2840.

The second major project will be the South Moreland Boulevard, Shaker Square, North Moreland Boulevard Rehabilitation. This project will affect North and South Moreland from Griffing Avenue to Larchmere Boulevard. Construction has begun this spring and is projected to be completed in 12 months. The estimated cost of the project is \$7 million and is being funded by Ohio Public Works Commission, Public Utilities, City Road & Bridge Bonds.

Improvements from this construction will include repairs to the roadway, reconfiguration of multiple intersections, replacement of curbs. Driveway aprons, sidewalks, and curb ramps as necessary, reconstruction of catch basins, and resetting utility castings. It will also include implementation of high visibility road markings, including bike lanes, the replacement of traffic signals at Buckeye Road/South Woodland and Drexmore Road.
